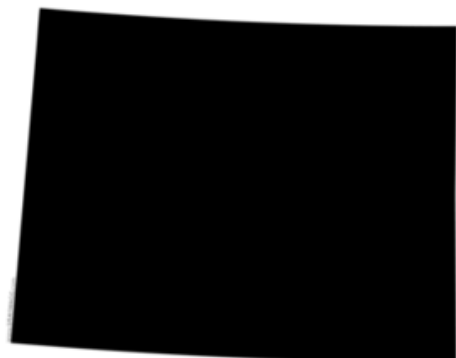


AUCD Centers Serving Wyoming
