
#### What is AUCD?










#### What is ITAC?



#### As a Network...

- Same overall mission, yet each of the programs have a unique focus and develops individual strengths
- ► LENDs come together regionally to address issues specific to their location
- ► LENDs come together nationally to address common concerns, develop and promote best practices, produce exceptional clinicians and leaders in a variety of disciplines, including community advocates, and help further systems change.

## What is a UCEDD Program?

- In 1963, President John F. Kennedy signed an Act into law, which established 19 university-based centers focused on intellectual disability research. Over time, changes and improvement led to the current Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act (DD Act). The DD Act makes sure that individuals with developmental disabilities and their families participate and have access to needed community services, individualized supports, and other forms of assistance that promote self-determination, independence, productivity and integration and inclusion in all parts of the community life. The DD Act authorizes the UCEDDs as part of the Developmental Disabilities Network in each state.
- The network of University Centers for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities (UCEDD) aims to positively affect the lives of all people with disabilities by building and strengthening systems that support full community participation. They work toward a vision of self-determination, independence, productivity, and community inclusion for people with disabilities throughout the lifespan.

#### Who are UCEDD Trainees?

- UCEDD trainees come from a wide range of cultural backgrounds and including individuals from many disciplines, including advocacy and family leadership. All current and recent former trainees are part of the AUCD Emerging Leaders Community.
- Emerging Leaders at UCEDDs are undergraduate, graduate, or doctoral students that support their Center's mission through research, service, and teaching in a variety of disciplines that may impact the lives of people with disabilities. At a UCEDD, Emerging Leaders could also be a fellow, research assistant, self-advocate, or family member who is committed to enhancing the quality of life of people with disabilities by learning from and collaborating with other experts.

#### What is the UCEDD Resource Center?

The UCEDD Resource Center (URC) is a project of AUCD funded by the Administration for Community Living (ACL) that provides coordinated, comprehensive, and specialized training and technical assistance to the national network of University Centers for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities Education, Research, & Service.



### How does AUCD support UCEDDs?

We work directly with programs to make sure that knowledge and effective training strategies are being shared.

This support can look like coordinating topical work groups, planning in-person or virtual meetings, highlighting creative projects, promoting trainee leadership, managing and analyzing data, developing resources, and building relationships with experts from outside the Network to help programs make a more significant impact.



### How does AUCD support UCEDDs?

The URC provides a wide range of support services that work toward achieving the long-term outcomes of:

- Positioning UCEDDs as leaders and catalysts of systems change, capacity building and advocacy at the international, national, state/territory, and local level;
- Positioning the UCEDD Network as a national and international resource that includes specific substantive areas of expertise that may be accessed and applied in diverse settings and circumstances;
- Increasing the capacity of UCEDDs to provide leadership in, advise Federal, State, and community
  policymakers about, and promote opportunities that lead to individuals with ID/DD exercising selfdetermination, becoming independent, productive, integrated, and included in all facets of community life;
- Increasing UCEDD's quality of data collection for Program Performance reporting (PPR) demonstrating the UCEDD Network's collective impact on the local, state, national, international levels; and
- Increasing the percentage of people with ID/IDD across racial, ethnic, and cultural groups reporting greater equity in opportunities within the UCEDD Network and in the community life.



#### URC Technical Assistance Offerings

- Universal TA (meets the TA needs of all grantees)
- Targeted TA (meets the TA needs shared by many grantees)
- Intensive TA (meets individual grantees' TA needs)



#### Intellectual and Developmental Research Centers

- Established in 1963 by Congress as "centers of excellence" for research in intellectual and developmental disabilities, Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities Research Centers (IDDRCs) represent the nation's first and foremost sustained effort to prevent and treat disabilities through biomedical and behavioral research.
- Eunice Kennedy Shriver National Institute for Child Health and Human Development's <u>Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities Branch</u> (IDDB) funds the program
- IDDRCs: Research, Education & Service
  - Research projects to build upon new knowledge and identify how alterations in biological processes may impact I/DD.
  - Educational opportunities such as Pre-Doctoral and Post-Doctoral Fellowships
  - Service in developing and implementing Evidence-Based Practices






