Call for Poster Presentations at the semi-annual AIR-P Research Day at AUCD 2024

AUTISM INTERVENTION RESEARCH NETWORK ON PHYSICAL HEALTH

The University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) leads the Autism Intervention Research Network on Physical Health (AIR-P) under the direction of Dr. Alice Kuo. Funded by the Maternal and Child Health Bureau, Health Resources and Services Administration, the AIR-P is an interdisciplinary, multicenter research network for scientific collaboration and infrastructure aimed at increasing life expectancy and quality of life for autistic individuals, with a focus on underserved/vulnerable populations.

The AIR-P supports innovative life course intervention research in six areas (Research Nodes):

- (1) primary care services and quality,
- (2) community-based lifestyle interventions,
- (3) gender, sexuality, and reproductive health,
- (4) health systems and services,
- (5) neurology, and
- (6) genetics.

The mission of the AIR-P is to develop a robust research infrastructure that will foster measurable improvements in optimal physical health and well-being of autistic individuals and their families across the lifespan. WHAT WE'RE LOOKING FOR IN APPLICATIONS:

- Research that:
 - o Is related to the physical health and overall well-being of autistic individuals.

AND

- o Impacts the community with its findings.
- Inclusive research practices.
- Autistic researchers and community stakeholders are highly encouraged to apply.
- Submissions of work in progress are encouraged.

WHAT YOU'LL DO IF ACCEPTED:

- 1. Create an e-poster, which you will print to use as your physical poster.
- 2. Create a 5-minute video presentation with slides and a transcript.
- 3. Present your research to an in-person audience with your physical poster by attending the AUCD 2024 conference.

NOTE: The e-poster, video, slides, and transcript will be made available for public viewing online before the event.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY:

Up to 5 of the accepted posters will be eligible for a scholarship of <u>up to \$500 to support travel</u> to the AUCD 2024 conference. All applicants will automatically be considered for this scholarship opportunity. Limitations apply. Paperwork and receipts required to receive scholarship as reimbursement after in-person presentation is completed. Please be sure to review the full details of the scholarship, including limitations and requirements, in the <u>reimbursement form</u>.



HOW DO I APPLY?

Fill out the AIR-P Research Day at AUCD 2024 Conference form by September 6, 2024.

Have the following information ready to apply:

- Lead and co-presenter(s) information
- Poster Presentation Title (20 words)
- Description: summarized, lay-friendly overview of your poster presentation (70 words)
- Abstract: in-depth description of your poster presentation (250 words)
- Answers to 2 "questions to address" (above)
- Answer to question about how the work uses inclusive research practices

By applying, you agree to:

- Notify co-presenters of requirements to present at this event.
- Create and submit all required materials (e-poster, slides, video, transcript) by the deadlines.
- Create materials that are accessible by following AUCD's guidelines.
- Allow AUCD to publish your materials for online viewing by the general public.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER I APPLY?

If accepted to create a poster, you will be asked to submit the following by October 11, 2024 (one month after you receive an invitation to present):

- E-poster (you will print this to use as your physical poster)
- Video presentation with slides and transcript

NOTE: The e-poster, video, slides, and transcript will be made available for public viewing online before the event.

Accepted presenters will attend the in-person AUCD 2024 conference to present their work between November 3-6, 2024.


WHAT ARE POSTER REVIEWERS LOOKING FOR?

Poster presentations submitted to present at Research Day will be judged on a set of criteria and scale by a team of AIR-P staff.

- Interest/impact to the autistic community:
 - How well does the work address issues that are important to the autistic community?
- Engagement and inclusion of autistic community stakeholders:
 - How well does the work practice or commit to inclusive research practices?
- Connection to the Principles and Values of AIR-P:
 - How well does the work connect to AIR-P values?
- Clarity of Proposed Poster Presentation:
 - How well does the work define its aims and relevant details?
